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This Little Light Of Mine, Light Of The World, Jesus Is The Truth And The Light, We Are Living Temples Of God's Spirit, Light Powered By God's Spirit, Jesus Is The Living Word And The Bread Of Life, Strengthened And Nourished By The Word, We Are Children Of Light, The Unchanging Father Of Lights, Jesus' Pre-Human Existence As A Being Of Spirit And Light, Jesus' Bright Appearance, Coming With Power And Great Glory, Every Eye Shall See Him As He Is, Old Testament Verses Which Describe The Brightness Of God The Father And Jesus Christ, New Testament Verses Which Describe Jesus' Glorified Form, Heavenly City Is Illuminated By Glory Of God The Father And Jesus Alone, The Glorious Brightness Of God's Mighty Angels

Many Christians are familiar with the childhood Christian song entitled "This Little Light of Mine". Written around the year 1920 by composer and teacher Harry Dixon Loes, the chorus of this beloved Christian hymn, which has been sung by both Christian children and adults all around the world for many decades, states as follows:

This little light of mine, I'm gonna let it shine This little light of mine, I'm gonna let it shine This little light of mine, I'm gonna let it shine Let it shine, Let it shine, Let it shine.

As you may know, it is commonly believed that Harry Dixon Loes based the lyrics for "This Little Light of Mine" on some or all of the following verses which are found in the Gospels of Matthew and Luke:

"Ye are the light of the world. A city that is set on an hill cannot be hid. Neither do men light a candle, and put it under a bushel, but on a candlestick; and it giveth light unto all that are in the house. Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven." Matthew 5:14-16, KJV

"No man, when he hath lighted a candle, putteth it in a secret place, neither under a bushel, but on a candlestick, that they which come in may see the light. The light of the body is the eye: therefore when thine eye is single, thy whole body also is full of light; but when thine eye is evil, thy body also is full of darkness. Take heed therefore that the light which is in thee be not darkness. If thy whole body therefore be full of light, having no part dark, the whole shall be full of light, as when the bright shining of a candle doth give thee light." Luke 11:33-36, KJV

Exactly why is it that Jesus refers to His followers as "the light of the world" in the previous verses? It is because we have the Light of God's Truth burning in each of our hearts; and the very essence of that Light and Truth is our faith in the Atoning Sacrifice of Jesus Christ, who Himself informs us that He is indeed the Truth, as well as the Light of the World, as we see by the following verses:

"Then spake Jesus again unto them, saying, I am the light of the world: he that followeth me shall not walk in darkness, but shall have the light of life." John 8:12, KJV

"As long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world." John 9:5, KJV

"Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me." John 14:6, KJV

But that is not all. As I point out in such articles as "A Treasure in Earthen Vessels: Promise of the Spirit", it is also because through our faith in Jesus Christ, we are in fact spiritually reborn, and thus become living vessels, or temples, for the Spirit of God which dwells in us. So from this, we can conclude that the "little light" of which Harry Dixon Loes speaks in the childhood hymn "This Little Light of Mine", is actually powered by the very Spirit of God. As the Apostle Paul informs us in his first Epistle to the Corinthians:

"Know ye not that ye are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwelleth in you? If any man defile the temple of God, him shall God destroy; for the temple of God is holy, which temple ye are." 1 Corinthians 3:16, 17, KJV

"What? know ye not that your body is the temple of the Holy Ghost which is in you, which ye have of God, and ye are not your own? For ye are bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body, and in your spirit, which are God's." 1 Corinthians 6:19-20, KJV

Because this "little light" is powered by the eternal Spirit of God which dwells in each one of us, unlike man's devices, its source of power will never diminish; provided of course that we continue to remain close to the Lord, in tune with His Spirit, and obedient to His Word. In fact, as I explain more thoroughly in other articles, God's Word is the Bread of Life which both sustains, strengthens and recharges our spirits; and to neglect partaking of this daily bread is foolishness on the part of Christian believers. As the Bible also informs us, Jesus Christ is the physical embodiment of the Word of God, which makes Him the Bread of Life as well. Consider these verses:

"Neither have I gone back from the commandment of his lips; I have esteemed the words of his mouth more than my necessary food." Job 23:12, KJV "But he answered and said, It is written, Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God. Matthew 4:4, KJV "So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God.' Romans 10:17, KJV "Thy word have I hid in mine heart, that I might not sin against thee." Psalms 119:11, KJV "And as they were eating, Jesus took bread, and blessed it, and brake it, and gave it to the disciples, and said, Take, eat; this is my body. And he took the cup, and gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, Drink ye all of it; For this is my blood of the new testament, which is shed for many for the remission of sins. Matthew 26:26-28, KJV "And Jesus said unto them, I am the bread of life: he that cometh to me shall never hunger; and he that believeth on me shall never thirst . . . I am that bread of life . Verily, verily, I say unto you, Except ye eat the flesh of the Son of man, and drink his blood, ye have no life in you. John 6:35, 48, 53b, KJV "Wheresoever the body is, thither will the eagles be gathered together.' Ľuke 17:37, KJV "For wheresoever the carcase is, there will the eagles be gathered together. Matthew 24:28, KJV "But they that wait upon the LORD shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run, and not be weary; and they shall walk, and not faint. Isaiah 40:31, KJV This concept of our being spiritual lights in the world is a topic which I first discussed in my 1997 article entitled "The Children of Light: Are You One of Us?". As I note there, through our faith in Jesus Christ, not only do we become the adopted sons and daughters of God, and members of His Royal Family, but we are also transforméd from being the Children of Darkness over whom the powers of darkness have control, into the Children of Light. If you haven't read that article in a while, or if you have never read it, then allow me to share a few verses with you concerning this topic:

"And the lord commended the unjust steward, because he had done wisely: for the children of this world are in their

generation wiser than the children of light." Luke 16:8, KJV

"While ye have light, believe in the light, that ye may be the children of light. These things spake Jesus, and departed, and did hide himself from them." John 12:36, KJV

"Be ye therefore followers of God, as dear children . . . For ye were sometimes darkness, but now are ye light in the Lord: walk as children of light . . . And have no fellowship with the unfruitful works of darkness, but rather reprove them."

Ephesians 5:1, 8, 11 KJV

"That ye may be blameless and harmless, the sons of God, without rebuke, in the midst of a crooked and perverse nation, among whom ye shine as lights in the world;" Philippians 2:15, KJV

"But ye, brethren, are not in darkness, that that day should overtake you as a thief. Ye are all the children of light, and the children of the day: we are not of the night, nor of darkness."

1 Thessalonians 5:4-5, KJV

It is plain to see then, that once we acknowledge our sinful condition, repent of our sins, and accept the Sacrifice of Jesus Christ -- who is the Light of the World -- as the only means of Atonement for our sins, we are indeed spiritually transformed into the Children of Light. Furthermore, we are told in the Epistle of James that our Heavenly Father is the "Father of Lights", which truly makes us His little lights who currently shine -- as the Apostle Paul informs us in the previous set of verses -- in this dark, evil world. Consider this verse:

"Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and cometh down from the Father of lights, with whom is no variableness, neither shadow of turning." James 1:17, KJV

As inspiring as the previous Scriptural truths are, some of you may not realize that there's a much more profound meaning to the phrase "Children of Light" than what meets the eye. In fact, I even mentioned it fourteen years ago in "The Children of Light: Are You One of Us?". Upon hearing or reading this phrase "the Children of Light", most Christians interpret it in a purely spiritual, symbolic or metaphorical sense. "Yes, we are the Children of Light as opposed to being the Children of Darkness" they say. While this is indeed true, a careful study of the Scriptures reveals that we are really limiting ourselves, and in fact shortchanging ourselves, when we adopt this superficial interpretation.

To fully understand this, let me remind you of something that Jesus said in the Gospel of John as He prayed to His Father. In the following verse, Jesus is obviously making a reference to His pre-human existence in Heaven, even before the Earth was ever created:

"And now, O Father, glorify thou me with thine own self with

the glory which I had with thee before the world was." John 17:5, KJV

Allow me to call your attention to the word "glory". Derived from the Greek word "doxa", the word "glory" has to do with how something or someone is viewed, and often refers to the actual physical appearance, splendor, magnificence, majesty or brightness of something, whether it is God the Father and Jesus Christ, the Angels, heavenly bodies such as the Sun, Moon and stars, or anything else. I believe that this is the glory that Jesus is talking about in the previous verse from the Gospel of John. In other words, the Lord appears to be referring to His magnificent -- and bright -- pre-human form in Heaven; that is, His true spiritual state as a wonderful Being of energy -- or Spirit -- and overpowering light.

In fact, you may recall that in his second Epistle to the Thessalonians, the Apostle Paul describes for us how the Antichrist is destroyed by the brightness of Christ's Coming. Consider this verse:

"And then shall that Wicked be revealed, whom the Lord shall consume with the spirit of his mouth, and shall destroy with the brightness of his coming:" 2 Thessalonians 2:8, KJV

We must conclude then, that based upon the actual meaning of the word "doxa", this very same brightness and magnificent physical appearance is the glory that Jesus is referring to when He speaks about returning in the glory of His Father with the Holy Angels, in the three Synoptic Gospels; that is, Matthew, Mark and Luke. Consider the following verses:

"For the Son of man shall come in the glory of his Father with his angels; and then he shall reward every man according to his works." Matthew 16:27, KJV

"And then shall appear the sign of the Son of man in heaven: and then shall all the tribes of the earth mourn, and they shall see the Son of man coming in the clouds of heaven with power and great glory." Matthew 24:30, KJV

"Whosoever therefore shall be ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation; of him also shall the Son of man be ashamed, when he cometh in the glory of his Father with the holy angels." Mark 8:38, KJV

"And then shall they see the Son of man coming in the clouds with great power and glory." Mark 13:26, KJV

"For whosoever shall be ashamed of me and of my words, of him shall the Son of man be ashamed, when he shall come in his own glory, and in his Father's, and of the holy angels." Luke 9:26, KJV

"And then shall they see the Son of man coming in a cloud with power and great glory." Luke 21:27, KJV Christ's Return to the Earth is going to be a very awesome, mind-boggling sight to behold; because as the Apostle John also tells us, "every eye shall see him", and "we shall see him as he is", in all His wonder and glory, as is made plain by these verses:

"Behold, he cometh with clouds; and every eye shall see him, and they also which pierced him: and all kindreds of the earth shall wail because of him. Even so, Amen." Revelation 1:7, KJV

"Beloved, now are we the sons of God, and it doth not yet appear what we shall be: but we know that, when he shall appear, we shall be like him; for we shall see him as he is."

1 John 3:2, KJV

Exactly how bright is the light of God the Father, Jesus His Son and the Holy Angels? We find a number of verses scattered throughout the pages of the Bible which indicate that they are indeed very bright. Think of the brightness of the Sun, or of a nuclear explosion, and then think some more. As we saw a moment ago, their glorious brightness is such, that the Antichrist is destroyed by it. It is a pure light, in which there is absolutely no darkness or variation at all; which is why James described the brightness of the Father of Lights as having "no variableness, neither shadow of turning", and the Apostle John wrote as follows:

"This then is the message which we have heard of him, and declare unto you, that God is light, and in him is no darkness at all." 1 John 1:5, KJV

In fact, in the Old Testament, Moses, King David and several of the Prophets all describe the brightness and glory of the Lord. Whether the following verses are describing God the Father or Jesus His Son, I will leave for you to determine:

"And the angel of the LORD appeared unto him in a flame of fire out of the midst of a bush: and he looked, and, behold, the bush burned with fire, and the bush was not consumed. And Moses said, I will now turn aside, and see this great sight, why the bush is not burnt. And when the LORD saw that he turned aside to see, God called unto him out of the midst of the bush, and said, Moses, Moses. And he said, Here am I. And he said, Draw not nigh hither: put off thy shoes from off thy feet, for the place whereon thou standest is holy ground. Moreover he said, I am the God of thy father, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob. And Moses hid his face; for he was afraid to look upon God."

"And he [Moses] said, I beseech thee, shew me thy glory. And he said, I will make all my goodness pass before thee, and I will proclaim the name of the LORD before thee; and will be gracious to whom I will be gracious, and will shew mercy on whom I will shew mercy. And he said, Thou canst not see my face: for there shall no man see me, and live. And the LORD said, Behold, there is a place by me, and thou shalt stand upon a rock: And it shall come to pass, while my glory passeth by, that I will put thee in a clift of the rock, and will cover thee with my hand while I pass by: And I will take away mine hand, and thou shalt see my back parts: but my face shall not be seen." Exodus 33:18-23, KJV

"And it came to pass, when Moses came down from mount Sinai with the two tables of testimony in Moses' hand, when he came down from the mount, that Moses wist not that the skin of his face shone while he talked with him [with the LORD]. And when Aaron and all the children of Israel saw Moses, behold, the skin of his face shone; and they were afraid to come nigh him. And Moses called unto them; and Aaron and all the rulers of the congregation returned unto him: and Moses talked with them. And afterward all the children of Israel came nigh: and he gave them in commandment all that the LORD had spoken with him in mount Sinai. And till Moses had done speaking with them, he put a vail on his face. But when Moses went in before the LORD to speak with him, he took the vail off, until he came out. And he came out, and spake unto the children of Israel that which he was commanded. And the children of Israel saw the face of Moses, that the skin of Moses' face shone: and Moses put the vail upon his face again, until he went in to speak with him [with the LORD]." Exodus 34:29-35, KJV

"Through the brightness before him were coals of fire kindled." 2 Samuel 22:13, KJV

"At the brightness that was before him his thick clouds passed, hail stones and coals of fire." Psalms 18:12, KJV

"For the LORD God is a sun and shield: the LORD will give grace and glory: no good thing will he withhold from them that walk uprightly." Psalms 84:11, KJV

"The sun shall be no more thy light by day; neither for brightness shall the moon give light unto thee: but the LORD shall be unto thee an everlasting light, and thy God thy glory. Thy sun shall no more go down; neither shall thy moon withdraw itself: for the LORD shall be thine everlasting light, and the days of thy mourning shall be ended." Isaiah 60:19-20, KJV

"And there was a voice from the firmament that was over their heads, when they stood, and had let down their wings. And above the firmament that was over their heads was the likeness of a throne, as the appearance of a sapphire stone: and upon the likeness of the throne was the likeness as the appearance of a man above upon it. And I saw as the colour of amber, as the appearance of fire round about within it, from the appearance of his loins even upward, and from the appearance of his loins even downward, I saw as it were the appearance of fire, and it had brightness round about. As the appearance of the bow that is in the cloud in the day of rain, so was the appearance of the likeness of the glory of the LORD. And when I saw it, I fell upon my face, and I heard a voice of one that spake." Ezekiel 1:25-28, KJV

"And it came to pass in the sixth year, in the sixth month, in the fifth day of the month, as I sat in mine house, and the elders of Judah sat before me, that the hand of the Lord GOD fell there upon me. Then I beheld, and lo a likeness as the appearance of fire: from the appearance of his loins even downward, fire; and from his loins even upward, as the appearance of brightness, as the colour of amber." Ezekiel 8:1-2, KJV

"Now the cherubims stood on the right side of the house, when the man went in; and the cloud filled the inner court. Then the glory of the LORD went up from the cherub, and stood over the threshold of the house; and the house was filled with the cloud, and the court was full of the brightness of the LORD'S glory." Ezekiel 10:3-4, KJV

"I beheld till the thrones were cast down, and the Ancient of days did sit, whose garment was white as snow, and the hair of his head like the pure wool: his throne was like the fiery flame, and his wheels as burning fire. A fiery stream issued and came forth from before him: thousand thousands ministered unto him, and ten thousand times ten thousand stood before him: the judgment was set, and the books were opened."

Daniel 7:9-10, KJV

"God came from Teman, and the Holy One from mount Paran. Selah. His glory covered the heavens, and the earth was full of his praise. And his brightness was as the light; he had horns coming out of his hand: and there was the hiding of his power. Before him went the pestilence, and burning coals went forth at his feet." Habakkuk 3:3-5, KJV

Turning to the New Testament, we discover that there are a variety of verses which describe Jesus in His glorified form. The first example involves the incident which occurred on the Mount of Transfiguration, when Jesus was suddenly transformed before Peter, James and John. Not only are we told that His garment turned very bright, but His face shone as the Sun as well. Consider these verses:

"And after six days Jesus taketh Peter, James, and John his brother, and bringeth them up into an high mountain apart, And was transfigured before them: and his face did shine as the sun, and his raiment was white as the light." Matthew 17:1-2, KJV

"And after six days Jesus taketh with him Peter, and James, and John, and leadeth them up into an high mountain apart by themselves: and he was transfigured before them. And his raiment became shining, exceeding white as snow; so as no fuller on earth can white them." Mark 9:2-3, KJV

Many years later, after being exiled by the Romans to the isle of Patmos in the Aegean Sea, the Apostle John received the Book of Revelation. In this final Book of the Bible, he also describes the appearance of the Resurrected Christ in His glorified form. Please notice that once again, John's description matches the previous verses that we examined, including the Lord's face shining like the Sun, and His hair being similar to extremely white wool:

"And in the midst of the seven candlesticks one like unto the Son of man, clothed with a garment down to the foot, and girt about the paps with a golden girdle. His head and his hairs were white like wool, as white as snow; and his eyes were as a flame of fire; And his feet like unto fine brass, as if they burned in a furnace; and his voice as the sound of many waters. And he had in his right hand seven stars: and out of his mouth went a sharp twoedged sword: and his countenance was as the sun shineth in his strength." Revelation 1:13-16, KJV

The extreme brightness of God the Father and His Son, Jesus Christ, is such, that in the closing chapters of the Book of Revelation, John informs us that the Heavenly City, that is, New Jerusalem, has no need of the Sun or of the Moon, because the City will be entirely lit by the glory of the Father and the Son, as we see by these verses:

"And the city had no need of the sun, neither of the moon, to shine in it: for the glory of God did lighten it, and the Lamb is the light thereof." Revelation 21:23, KJV

"And there shall be no night there; and they need no candle, neither light of the sun; for the Lord God giveth them light: and they shall reign for ever and ever . . . I Jesus have sent mine angel to testify unto you these things in the churches. I am the root and the offspring of David, and the bright and morning star." Revelation 22:5, 16, KJV

The previous two verses sound very similar to what we read earlier in the sixtieth chapter of the Book of Isaiah, even though these two Books were written over eight hundred years apart.

But what about the Angels? Do they likewise shine with a wonderful brightness and splendor similar to the Father and the Son? I am happy to report that the Scriptures reveal that they do indeed, as can be seen by the following verses that are found in the Apocalypse, or the Book of Revelation. In the first verse, we are told that the brightness of the Angel's face is such, that it is even compared to the Sun. Eight chapters later, we are told that the bright appearance -- or glory -- of another Angel even brightens up the Earth:

"And I saw another mighty angel come down from heaven, clothed with a cloud: and a rainbow was upon his head, and his face was as it were the sun, and his feet as pillars of fire:"

Revelation 10:1, KJV

"And after these things I saw another angel come down from heaven, having great power; and the earth was lightened with his glory." Revelation 18:1, KJV We find a very similar event occurring in the Gospel of Luke. All Christians are familiar with the wonderful story of the Birth of Jesus Christ, and how His Birth was announced to a group of shepherds who were abiding in the field. But do you recall how the Announcing Angel was described? Consider this:

"And there were in the same country shepherds abiding in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. And, lo, the angel of the Lord came upon them, and the glory of the Lord shone round about them: and they were sore afraid." Luke 2:8-9, KJV

So once again we see that the Glory of the Lord shines very brightly, and that the word "glory" refers to an observable, physical effect. It signifies a very bright and overwhelming appearance.

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Jesus' Glorious Brightness Blinds Saul Of Tarsus On The Road To Damascus, Ananias Heals Saul And Saul Becomes A Christian, Physical Brightness Of The Sun Moon And Stars Is An Example, We Shall Be Changed At The Last Trump, We Shall Be Like Him, Daniel Prophesied Exact Same Thing Hundreds Of Years Earlier, We Shall Shine As The Brightness Of The Firmament And As The Stars Forever, Jesus Is The Firstfruits Of The Resurrection, Coleman Kerosene Lanterns, The Spirit Without Measure, Be A Burning Ember And Burn Brightly For The Lord, Coming In The Clouds Of Heaven, Unusual Bright Fiery Clouds In The Bible

If you are familiar with the Book of Acts, then you will know that in chapter nine, the Apostle Paul -- who at that time was still known as Saul of Tarsus -- had a firsthand experience with the blinding brightness of the Resurrected Jesus Christ. It is for this same reason that he was able to write about it later on in his Epistle to the Hebrews, as we see here:

"At midday, 0 king, I saw in the way a light from heaven, above the brightness of the sun, shining round about me and them which journeyed with me."

Acts 26:13, KJV

"Who being the brightness of his glory, and the express image of his person, and upholding all things by the word of his power, when he had by himself purged our sins, sat down on the right hand of the Majesty on high;" Hebrews 1:3, KJV

Here again we see that the Glory of the Lord is described as being "above the brightness of the sun". I can't even begin to fathom such a brightness; can you? It is no surprise then that Saul of Tarsus was blinded by the same, and was unable to see for three days until a Disciple named Ananias obeyed the Lord and went to heal this notorious persecutor of God's children. Consider the following verses:

"And Saul, yet breathing out threatenings and slaughter against the disciples of the Lord, went unto the high priest, And desired of him letters to Damascus to the synagogues, that if he found any of this way, whether they were men or women, he might bring them bound unto Jerusalem. And as he journeyed, he came near Damascus: and suddenly there shined round about him a light from heaven: And he fell to the earth, and heard a voice saying unto him, Saul, Saul, why persecutest thou me? And he said, Who art thou, Lord? And the Lord said, I am Jesus whom thou persecutest: it is hard for thee to kick against the pricks. And he trembling and astonished said, Lord, what wilt thou have me to do? And the Lord said unto him, Arise, and go into the city, and it shall be told thee what thou must do. And the men which journeyed with him stood speechless, hearing a voice, but seeing no man. And Saul arose from the earth; and when his eyes were opened, he saw no man: but they led him by the hand, and brought him into Damascus. And he was three days without sight, and neither did eat nor drink. And there was a certain disciple at Damascus, named Ananias; and to him said the Lord in a vision, Ananias. And he said, Behold, I am here, Lord. And the Lord said unto him, Arise, and go into the street which is called Straight, and enquire in the house of Judas for one called Saul, of Tarsus: for, behold, he prayeth, And hath seen in a vision a man named Ananias coming in, and putting his hand on him, that he might receive his sight. Then Ananias answered, Lord, I have heard by many of this man, how much evil he hath done to thy saints at Jerusalem: And here he hath authority from the chief priests to bind all that call on thy name. But the Lord said unto him, Go thy way: for he is a chosen vessel unto me, to bear my name before the Gentiles, and kings, and the children of Israel: For I will shew him how great things he must suffer for my name's sake. And Ananias went his way, and entered into the house; and putting his hands on him said, Brother Saul, the Lord, even Jesus, that appeared unto thee in the way as thou camest, hath sent me, that thou mightest receive thy sight, and be filled with the Holy Ghost. And immediately there fell from his eyes as it had been scales: and he received sight forthwith, and arose, and was baptized. And when he had received meat, he was strengthened. Then was Saul certain days with the disciples which were at Damascus. And straightway he preached Christ in the synagogues, that he is the Son of God." Acts 9:1-20, KJV

As I explained in part one, the word "glory" -- or "doxa" in Greek -- is not restricted to describing the brightness of Spiritual Beings alone. The Apostle Paul also uses this word to describe the splendid, bright appearance of the heavenly bodies as well; that is, the Sun, Moon and stars. In fact, Paul uses the brightness of God's physical creations as an example to help us to understand the greater realities which are yet to come. Consider the following verses from Paul's first Epistle to the Corinthians, where he describes the Resurrection of the Dead, and the Glorious Transformation of the Children of Light:

"There are also celestial bodies, and bodies terrestrial: but the glory of the celestial is one, and the glory of the terrestrial is another. There is one glory of the sun, and another glory of the moon, and another glory of the stars: for one star differeth from another star in glory. So also is the resurrection of the dead. It is sown in corruption; it is raised in incorruption: It is sown in dishonour; it is raised in glory: it is sown in weakness; it is raised in power: It is sown a natural body; it is raised a spiritual body. There is a natural body, and there is a spiritual body . . . Behold, I shew you a mystery; We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed, In a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trump: for the trumpet shall sound, and the dead shall be raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed."

1 Corinthians 15:40-44, 51-52, KJV

As Paul writes, at the sound of the Last Trump, we shall be changed; and as we saw in part one, the Apostle John informs us that "we shall be like him". Let me share that verse with you once again, because there is something very interesting about its verse reference. John wrote:

"Beloved, now are we the sons of God, and it doth not yet appear what we shall be: but we know that, when he shall appear, we shall be like him; for we shall see him as he is."

1 John 3:2, KJV

Beloved, please take note! We are going to "be like Him"! If we are going to "be like Him" -- that is, like Jesus -- what exactly can we expect? While I have discussed this topic in other articles, there is one attribute concerning our coming Transformation which I don't believe I have ever talked about before; and I have spent most of this current article telling you about it. What is it? It is the glorious brightness that we shall acquire once we put on our New Bodies. What I find amazing, is the fact that the Prophet Daniel was shown the exact same thing over six hundred years earlier. Not only that, but in the place where Daniel writes this, the verse reference is very similar to John's verse above, as we see here:

"And they that be wise shall shine as the brightness of the firmament; and they that turn many to righteousness as the stars for ever and ever." Daniel 12:3, KJV

So 1 John 3:2 informs us that "we shall be like him", and we are told in Daniel 12:3 exactly what that means: We shall

shine brightly just like the stars -- and don't forget that Jesus is the Morning Star -- forever and ever. So both Paul and Daniel use the same terminology to describe what it means to "be like him". It is no wonder then that Paul also writes the following:

"But as it is written, Eye hath not seen, nor ear heard, neither have entered into the heart of man, the things which God hath prepared for them that love him." 1 Corinthians 2:9, KJV

Brethren and fellow believers in Christ, the Scriptures have spoken clearly. One of these days, if we remain faithful in the things which the Lord has called each of us to do during our brief sojourn on this Earth, our little lights are indeed going to shine; not just in a symbolic sense, but in a very real physical sense as well. We will "shine as the brightness of the firmament and . . . as the stars for ever and ever". That is what it means to "be like him". We shall possess the same form and glory -- or brilliant physical appearance -- as Jesus does; because as the Scriptures inform us, Jesus is the Firstfruits of the Resurrection; which means that someday we shall follow Him into the Resurrection, and will likewise be transformed. Consider the following verses:

"For we know that the whole creation groaneth and travaileth in pain together until now. And not only they, but ourselves also, which have the firstfruits of the Spirit, even we ourselves groan within ourselves, waiting for the adoption, to wit, the redemption of our body . . . For whom he did foreknow, he also did predestinate to be conformed to the image of his Son, that he might be the firstborn among many brethren."

Romans 8:22-23, 29, KJV

"If in this life only we have hope in Christ, we are of all men most miserable. But now is Christ risen from the dead, and become the firstfruits of them that slept. For since by man came death, by man came also the resurrection of the dead. For as in Adam all die, even so in Christ shall all be made alive. But every man in his own order: Christ the firstfruits; afterward they that are Christ's at his coming." 1 Corinthians 15:19-23, KJV

"Giving thanks unto the Father, which hath made us meet to be partakers of the inheritance of the saints in light: Who hath delivered us from the power of darkness, and hath translated us into the kingdom of his dear Son: In whom we have redemption through his blood, even the forgiveness of sins: Who is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of every creature . . . And he is the head of the body, the church: who is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead; that in all things he might have the preeminence." Colossians 1:12-15, 18, KJV

"To the general assembly and church of the firstborn, which are written in heaven, and to God the Judge of all, and to the spirits of just men made perfect," Hebrews 12:23, KJV

"Of his own will begat he us with the word of truth, that we should be a kind of firstfruits of his creatures."

James 1:18, KJV

"And from Jesus Christ, who is the faithful witness, and the first begotten of the dead, and the prince of the kings of the earth. Unto him that loved us, and washed us from our sins in his own blood," Revelation 1:5, KJV

"These are they which were not defiled with women; for they are virgins. These are they which follow the Lamb whithersoever he goeth. These were redeemed from among men, being the firstfruits unto God and to the Lamb." Revelation 14:4, KJV

I am reminded of the Coleman kerosene lanterns that we used when I used to go on nighttime fishing trips with my dad as a boy. I imagine that they sell more modern versions of them today. If I recall correctly, they had two valves or knobs on the side. One was to control the oxygen level, while the other one was to control the amount of fuel that was fed to the wick. The brightness of the lantern could be adjusted accordingly by turning the two knobs or valves. When set to high intensity, one could barely look at the wick. That is nothing compared to the Glory of the Lord!

In a sense, right now the amount of light that we are able to project as the Children of Light is restricted, because our reservoir of oil -- or Spiritual Anointing -- is also limited. Unless Jesus, we haven't been given a full dose of the Spirit without measure, as we see by these verses:

"For he whom God hath sent speaketh the words of God: for God giveth not the Spirit by measure unto him." John 3:34, KJV

"For in him dwelleth all the fulness of the Godhead bodily." Colossians 2:9, KJV

However, one of these days, when we acquire our New Bodies at the time of Christ's Return, we will be freed from the shackles of these physical bodies of flesh and blood, and we shall truly burn freely and brightly for the Glory of God the Father. Won't that be the day! On a related note, you may also be interested in reading my article entitled "Are You A Burning Ember For The Lord?".

Before concluding this current article, let me share with you one more tantalizing clue from the Holy Scriptures. I've spent the bulk of this article explaining to you how we are the Children of Light; how the word "glory" refers to the actual bright appearance of God the Father, Jesus the Son, and the Holy Angels; how we shall see Jesus as He truly is when He returns; and how someday we shall be transformed, and will radiate with the same glorious, bright appearance as our Lord, because we will be like Him; that is, if we remain faithful.

All this talk about glory and brightness. Is that the end of it? Well, not quite. As we saw earlier, the Bible informs us that Jesus shall return someday "in the clouds of heaven". Following are a few verses to refresh your memory: "And then shall appear the sign of the Son of man in heaven: and then shall all the tribes of the earth mourn, and they shall see the Son of man coming in the clouds of heaven with power and great glory." Matthew 24:30, KJV

"Jesus saith unto him, Thou hast said: nevertheless I say unto you, Hereafter shall ye see the Son of man sitting on the right hand of power, and coming in the clouds of heaven." Matthew 26:64, KJV

"And Jesus said, I am: and ye shall see the Son of man sitting on the right hand of power, and coming in the clouds of heaven." Mark 14:62, KJV

While all of the previous verses speak of clouds in a plural sense -- which no doubt leads most Christians to assume that they are referring to actual physical clouds -- personally, I am intrigued by the fact that there also exist a number of verses scattered throughout the Bible which speak of single clouds. For example, in his Gospel, Matthew very specifically describes "a bright cloud" on the top of the Mount, and in the Old Testament the Prophet Ezekiel describes a bright, rotating cloud that is enveloped by fire. In some cases, we are told that voices emanate from these single clouds, while in other cases, these clouds serve as transportation devices to carry people to and from Heaven. Consider the following examples:

"And I looked, and, behold, a whirlwind came out of the north, a great cloud, and a fire infolding itself, and a brightness was about it, and out of the midst thereof as the colour of amber, out of the midst of the fire." Ezekiel 1:4, KJV

"While he yet spake, behold, a bright cloud overshadowed them: and behold a voice out of the cloud, which said, This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased; hear ye him." Matthew 17:5, KJV

"And there was a cloud that overshadowed them: and a voice came out of the cloud, saying, This is my beloved Son: hear him." Mark 9:7, KJV

"While he thus spake, there came a cloud, and overshadowed them: and they feared as they entered into the cloud." Luke 9:34, KJV

"And then shall they see the Son of man coming in a cloud with power and great glory." Luke 21:27, KJV

"And when he had spoken these things, while they beheld, he was taken up; and a cloud received him out of their sight." Acts 1:9, KJV

"And I saw another mighty angel come down from heaven, clothed with a cloud: and a rainbow was upon his head, and his face was as it were the sun, and his feet as pillars of fire:" Revelation 10:1, KJV

"And they heard a great voice from heaven saying unto them, Come up hither. And they ascended up to heaven in a cloud; and their enemies beheld them." Revelation 11:12, KJV

Now, obviously, the aforementioned clouds possess qualities which you will not find in a regular cloud that consists of water vapor; so what are they? Why are some of them bright, or enveloped in fire, while others are not? Do these strange clouds represent the Shekinah Glory, or perhaps something else? For possible answers to these questions and more, I encourage you to read my five series "Under the Cloud: UFO's and the Holy Bible", as well as my three-part series called "Chariots of Fire: A Voluntary Voyage to Heaven?". Perhaps there is more here than what at first meets the eye.

With these final thoughts I will bring another article to its conclusion. I trust that you have found it both informative, as well as inspiring. Keep shining your little light for the Lord, and someday you will share in His Glory as well.

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
